Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the Relationship Between Alcohol Sales and Substance Abuse in the State of Maine.

Sec. 1. Study commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Relationship Between Alcohol Sales and 2 Substance Abuse in the State of Maine, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Members. Resolved: That the commission is composed 6 of 7 members as follows: 8 Three members of the House of Representatives appointed 1. 10 by the Speaker of the House; 12 Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of 2. the Senate; 14 3. The Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services or the commissioner's designee; and 16 18 4. One member appointed by the Governor; and be it further Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member 20 is the Senate chair and the first named House member is the House 22 chair; and be it further Sec. 4. Duties of commission. Resolved: That the commission 24 shall: 26 1. Study the relationship between liquor sales and 28 substance abuse in Maine; 30 Study the impact of substance abuse on individuals and 2. their families; 32 3. Study the financial impact of substance abuse on state 34 and community resources, including the health care and corrections system; 36 Perform an evaluation of the availability of treatment 4. 38 and other services currently being provided; and 40 5. Recommend changes to lessen the impact of substance abuse in the State; and be it further 42 Sec. 5. Appointments: meetings. **Resolved:** That all 44 appointments must be made within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve; and be it further 46 Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the 48 legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses 50

incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the
commission. Public members who are not otherwise compensated by
their employer or other entities whom they represent are entitled
to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their
attendance at meetings of the commission. The Executive Director
of the Legislative Council shall administer the commission's
budget; and be it further

Sec. 7. Staffing. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide staff assistance to the commission; and be it further

14 Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, 16 to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by January 15, 2002. If the commission requires a limited extension of time 18 to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
