## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §1081, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1987, c. 641, §1, is further amended to read:

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6 1. Commission. The Maine Unemployment Insurance Commission shall-consist consists of 3 5 members, one 2 of whom shall must be a-representative representatives of labor, one 2 of whom shall 8 must be a-representative representatives of employers and one of 10 whom shall must be a representative of the general public who shall must be impartial and an attorney admitted to the practice of law in the State and-shall-be-the-chairman-of-the-commission. 12 Of the 5 members, one must be a woman. The members shall elect the chair. Except as provided in this subsection, the 3 5 14 members and their successors shall--be are appointed by the Governor with a regional distribution throughout the State, 16 subject to review by the joint standing committee of the 18 Legislature having jurisdiction over labor and to confirmation by the Senate, to hold office for a term of 6 years or until a successor has been duly appointed and confirmed, except that any 20 member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which a predecessor was appointed 22 shall-be is appointed for the remainder of the term. During a term of membership on the commission, a member shall may not 24 engage in any other business, vocation or employment, nor serve as an officer or committee member of any political organization. 26

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Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §1081, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1987, c. 641,  $\S2$ , is further amended to read:

3. Quorum. Any 2 3 members of the commission shall Whenever the commission hears any case 32 constitute a quorum. under this chapter and Title 36, chapter 831, the ehairman chair shall act alone in the absence or disqualification of any other 34 member, provided that in the event of illness or extended absence 36 on the part of the ehairman chair or in the event of a vacancy in that position, the remaining members may act on appeals, conduct 38 hearings, and render decisions, provided beth all members agree. Except as otherwise provided, no vacancy may impair the right of the remaining members to exercise all of the powers of the 40 commission. Any action, decision, order, rule or recommendation which that is required by law to be made by the Maine 42 Unemployment Insurance Commission shall may not be made until the commission has held a meeting in the regular course of its 44 business for which all members have been provided with reasonable notice of the meeting and its agenda. 46

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## Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §1081, sub-§§4 and 5 are enacted to read:

50 4. Report. The commission shall report each year to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 52 over labor matters. The report must include the disposition of
