The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services will require additional General Fund appropriations of \$2,119,850 and \$2,113,036, respectively, to adjust contracts with providers of services to adults with mental retardation to provide a one-time 4% cost-of-living increase for direct care workers.

The Medical Care - Payments to Providers program within the Department of Human Services will require additional Federal Expenditures Fund allocations of \$3,938,365 and \$3,945,180 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively, for the federal match.'

This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The amendment clarifies that the pay increase would apply to persons providing services to adults with mental retardation. It removes from the resolve the provision that would have required the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to pay for pension costs for direct care mental retardation workers. It adds an appropriation, an allocation and a fiscal note to the resolve.
