Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, under the current law, the Youth in Need of
Services Oversight Committee is scheduled for repeal on June 30, 2001; and
Whereas, this legislation removes the repealer in order to
ensure the continuation of the oversight committee; and
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore,
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4099, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 778, §2, is amended to read:
§4099. Repeal
This-subchapter-is Sections 4095 to 4097 are repealed June 30, 2001.
Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
