2 <del>1</del>	The bill retroactively adds carry-forward language to Public Law 1999, chapter 401, Part KK. That action would authorize the unobligated balance of \$139,230 that was available on June 30, 2000 to be carried forward and used for school breakfast
5	incentive grants. As of April 19, 2001, the unobligated balance of those funds was \$121,605. Absent the carry-forward language,
B O	any unobligated funds would lapse to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.'
2	SUMMARY
<b>4</b> 5	This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment retroactively amends an appropriation for a school breakfast incentive grant program included in a 1999 supplemental budget to
3	allow unexpended balances in that account to carry forward from year to year to be used for school breakfast incentive grants. Without this retroactive amendment, those unexpended balances

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- would lapse to the General Fund. This amendment does not appropriate any new money for that program. The amendment changes the standard determining which schools are eligible to participate in the program to that standard originally proposed
- in the bill. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
