Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:	
Sec. 1. 12 MRSA c. 613 is enacted to read:

§6271. Definitions	
As used in this chapter, unless the context	otherwise
indicates, the following terms have the following meaning	
1. Commercial activity. "Commercial activity"	<u>means a</u>
marine-related activity conducted on a regular basis for	
other valuable remuneration. It includes but is not 1	<u>imited to</u>
carrying passengers or freight, harvesting, proces	
selling seafood and renting moorings or dock space to boa	t owners.
2. Marine dredge spoils. "Marine dredge spoil	s" means
naterial dredged or removed from land continually submer	
salt water or intertidal waters to assist or further a c	
activity.	
6272. Testing and disposal of marine dredge spoils	
1. Administration. The department shall administ	
for the testing of marine dredge spoils and the dis	
marine dredge spoils that are special waste or hazardo	
as defined in Title 38, section 1303-C and rules	
Department of Environmental Protection, in order to	-

A. Any bonds issued by the department under this s	ection or

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2. Plans and specifications. Prior to issuing any funding,
the department shall review and approve plans and specifications for the testing of marine dredge spoils and the disposal of
marine dredge spoils that are special or hazardous waste. The review must be in accordance with guidelines for testing and
disposal established by the Department of Environmental Protection for these materials and in accordance with the guidelines established by the department.

10 3. Rulemaking. The program of testing and disposal of marine dredge spoils must be administered in accordance with 12 rules adopted for that purpose by the department. Rules adopted under this section are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 14 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

Sec. 2. Fund allocation criteria; application. In accordance with 16 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, chapter 613, the Department 18 Marine Resources of shall submit proposed legislation establishing criteria for the allocation of funds under Title 12, 20 section 6272 to the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources no later than January 31, 2002, which the committee may use to 22 report out a bill. Funding under Title 12, section 6272 may not be approved by the Department of Marine Resources until the 24 effective date of the law enacting the criteria for approval.

SUMMARY

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Marine dredging of harbors, channels and boat slips is 30 necessary for the continued operation of commercial marine activities. Marine dredge spoils often contain contaminants that 32 classify the spoils as special or hazardous waste under state law. The testing of the spoils and the proper disposal of them 34 if they are contaminated is prohibitively expensive for many owners of commercial waterfront property. As a result, dredging 36 necessary to maintain or improve waterfront property that is critical to a number of marine-related activities like fishing is 38 not being done. This bill creates a program under the Department of Marine Resources for funding the testing of dredge spoils and 40 the proper disposal of contaminated spoils.
