Resolve, Requiring the Maine Municipal Association, the Maine County Commissioners Association and the Office of the Governor to Establish a Permanent Statewide Intergovernmental Advisory Commission.

Sec. 1. Advisory commission established. Resolved: That the Advisory Commission, referred to in this 2 Intergovernmental resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 21 members: 6 8 Seven members from the State appointed by the Governor, 1. 5 of whom must be commissioners and 2 of whom must be Legislators; 10 2. Seven county officials appointed by the Maine County Commissioners Association; and 12 14 Seven municipal officers appointed by the 3. Maine Municipal Association; and be it further 16 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the 2 Legislators are cochairs; and be it further 18 Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** 20 Sec. 4. That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 22 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing 24 authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the 26 commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further 28 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall: 30 Study ways to reduce duplication among all 3 levels of 1. 32 government in the State as well as within each level of government; 34 2. Promote communications, cooperation and efficient 36 delivery of services; 38 Monitor and discuss demands one level of government 3. makes of another level; and 40 Develop a mechanism to establish a permanent Statewide 4. Intergovernmental Advisory Commission; and be it further 42 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: 44 That the State Planning Office, the Maine Municipal Association and the Maine County 46 Commissioners Association shall staff the commission out of existing resources and shall contribute funds equally to pay for 48 any agreed upon expenses; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

8 Sec. 8. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 10 with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 12 Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its 14 approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the 16 commission chairs and staff with a status report on the 18 commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.
