Sec. 7. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§18 is enacted to read:

18. Bonds for grants to Maine students and postsecondary 22 professorships and other endowed faculty positions. To borrow money and issue bonds, notes, bond anticipation notes and other 24 obligations of the authority for the purpose of making loans and grants to foundations or programs that in turn make or match 26 grants to the State's high school graduates or other students or postsecondary professors or other endowed faculty positions for 28 postsecondary education or study and to fund and refund the same. These high school graduates or other students must be 30 eligible students under Title 20-A, section 11702, subsection 6. The professors or other endowed faculty must be eligible under Title 20-A, section 10006. The provisions of section 2061 are 32 not applicable to any obligations described in this subsection.  faculty positions at the University of Maine System and each of its universities, the Maine Technical College System and
 each of its colleges or the Maine Maritime Academy.

28 Sec. 10. Transfer of funds. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,500,000
30 by June 30, 2001 from the Abandoned Property Fund to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

Sec. 11. State Controller; postclosing. The State Controller is authorized to keep open the official system of general accounts of State Government for fiscal year 2000-01 in order to make post-closing entries and adjustments to carry out the provisions of this Act requiring the transfer of funds from the Abandoned Property Fund.

- 40 Sec. 12. Retroactivity. That section of this Act that requires the State Controller to transfer funds from the Abandoned

FISCAL NOTE

The amendment increases General Fund revenue as an offset to General Fund appropriations required in order to provide capitalization for the Maine Scholarship Endowment Fund and the Endowment Incentive Fund and clarifies that the Finance Authority of Maine may not assess the 1% fee for administrative costs until fiscal year 2003-04.

22 The amendment includes General Fund appropriations to the Finance Authority of Maine of \$100,000 in each of fiscal years 24 2001-02 and 2002-03 for the first 2 years of administrative costs and expenses of the Maine Scholarship Foundation.

The amendment also includes a General Fund appropriation of 28 \$272,528 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the Maine Scholarship Endowment Fund, which is administered by the Office of the 30 Treasurer of State, to provide capitalization for the endowment.

32 The amendment also includes General Fund appropriations of \$145,043 and \$882,429 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, 34 respectively, to the Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority for the first 2 years of an estimated 10 36 years of debt service payments on bonds that will be issued by the authority for additional capitalization of the Maine 38 Scholarship Endowment Fund and for the Endowment Incentive Fund.

40 The amendment increases General Fund revenue by \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2000-01 by requiring the transfer of that amount
42 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the Abandoned Property Fund by June 30, 2001.
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The requirement that the State Controller annually transfer 46 available balances of the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Scholarship Endowment Fund as the next priority 48 after the transfer to the Maine Rainy Day Fund or the Retiree Health Insurance Internal Services Fund will reduce amounts that 50 might otherwise have been transferred for other programs such as

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the Governor's Contingent Account, the Reserve for General Fund
 Operating Capital and the Loan Insurance Reserve. The impact of this transfer on these or other programs can not be determined at
 this time.

SUMMARY

This amendment provides capital to the Maine Scholarship 10 Endowment Fund by authorizing an annual transfer from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund of up to \$10,000,000 12 annually as the next priority after the transfer to the Maine Rainy Day Fund and the Retiree Health Insurance Internal Service 14 Fund. It provides a limitation for the aggregate amount of transfers to the endowment fund and a process for transfers from 16 the unappropriated surplus when the balance of the endowment falls below a certain level.

The amendment also reduces the amount of funding available for the administrative costs and other expenses of the Maine Scholarship Foundation for fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03 to \$100,000 annually and provides General Fund appropriations to the Finance Authority of Maine for these costs.

The amendment also amends the laws of the Maine Health and 26 Higher Educational Facilities Authority to allow the authority to issue bonds to provide additional capitalization for the Maine 28 Scholarship Endowment Fund. It authorizes the authority to issue up to \$7,100,000 in securities of which \$1,100,000 will be 30 provided to the Endowment Incentive Fund and \$6,000,000 will be provided to the Maine Scholarship Endowment Fund. Of the \$1,100,000 provided to the Endowment Incentive Fund, \$1,000,000 32 must be used to match private donations for scholarships and financial assistance for students and the remaining \$100,000 must 34 be used to match private donations to fund professorships or 36 other endowed faculty positions at the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System or the Maine Maritime 38 Academy. It provides General Fund appropriations to the authority for the first 2 years of debt service payments associated with that issuance. 40

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Finally, the amendment requires the transfer of \$1,500,000 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the
