10 section 10006. "Maine scholarship provider" means a private. nonprofit organization qualified under the United States Internal
12 Revenue Code of 1986, Section 501(c)(3) whose principal purpose is to provide scholarships to residents of the State who are or
14 will be attending Maine institutions of higher education.

Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §2053, sub-§6, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 680, §6, is amended to read:

In the case of a participating institution for higher 20 acquisition, construction, education, the improvement, reconstruction or equipping of, or construction of an addition or additions to, any structure designed for use as 22 a dormitory or other housing facility, dining facility, 24 student union, academic building, administrative facility, library, classroom building, research facility, faculty 26 facility, office facility, athletic facility, health care laboratory, maintenance, facility, storage or utility facility or other building or structure essential, necessary 28 or useful for instruction in a program of education provided 30 by an institution for higher education, or any multi-purpose structure designed to combine 2 or more of the functions 32 performed by the types of structures enumerated in this paragraph or, in the case of the Endowment Incentive Fund, 34 the funding of the Endowment Incentive Fund to provide matching gifts and grants to students pursuant to Title 20-A, section 10006 or, in the case of a Maine scholarship 36 provider, providing matching funds to qualifying gifts to residents of the State who are or will be attending a Maine 38 institution of higher education. "Project" includes all real and personal property, lands, improvements, driveways, 40 roads, approaches, pedestrian access roads, rights-of-way, utilities, easements and other interests in land, machinery 42 and equipment, and all appurtenances and facilities either on, above or under the ground which that are used or usable 44 in connection with any of the structures mentioned in this 46 paragraph, and also includes landscaping, site preparation, furniture, machinery, equipment and other similar items necessary or convenient for the operation of a particular 48 facility or structure in the manner for which its use is intended, but does not include such items as books, fuel, 50

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supplies or other items which <u>that</u> are customarily considered as a current operating charge. <u>For purposes of</u> <u>this paragraph, "qualifying gift" means a gift of at least</u> <u>\$500,000 from a single donor or multiple donors who agree to</u> <u>aggregate their gifts.</u>

Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§16, as amended by PL 1999, c. 231, §1, is further amended to read:

10 16. Bulk purchases. To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, finance, sell and transfer for, to or on behalf of itself and any eligible entities organized pursuant to the United 12 States Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 or in partnership with any of its eligible entities organized pursuant to the United 14 States Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 commodities necessary for the daily operation of the facilities of the eligible 16 entities, including, but not limited to, electricity, petroleum products, fuel oil and natural gas. For purposes authorized in 18 this subsection, the University of Maine System and its colleges and universities are eligible participating institutions under 20 the definition of eligible participant for the authority; and

Sec. 6. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§17, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 385, §4, is amended to read:

Nonprofit corporation. In accordance with 26 17. the limitations and restrictions of this chapter, to cause any of its powers, duties, programs or operations to be carried out by one 28 or more nonprofit corporations. Nonprofit corporations acting at the direction of the authority must be organized and operated 30 under the Maine Nonprofit Corporation Act. For the purposes authorized in this section the University of Maine System and its 32 colleges and universities are eligible participating institutions under the definition of eligible participant for the authority -: 34 and

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Sec. 7. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§18 is enacted to read:

18. Bonds for grants to Maine students. To borrow money 40 and issue bonds, notes, bond anticipation notes and other obligations of the authority for the purpose of making loans and grants to foundations or programs that in turn make or match 42 scholarship grants to the State's high school graduates or other 44 students for postsecondary education. These high school graduates or other students must be residents of the State who are or will be attending Maine institutions of higher education. 46 The provisions of section 2061 are not applicable to any 48 obligations described in this subsection. The authority at no time may have bonds outstanding, excluding refunding bonds, for the purposes of this subsection in an amount in excess of 50

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\$15,000,000.

Sec. 8. 22 MRSA §2061, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 390,  $\S23$ , is further amended to read: 4

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1. Assistance. Such project will enable or assist a health care facility to fulfill its obligation to provide health care 8 facilities or an institution for higher education to provide educational facilities within the State or, in the case of a 10 Maine scholarship provider or similar eligible institution, the opportunity for state residents to attend postsecondary 12 educational programs in the State;

Sec. 9. Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority; 14 issuance of securities. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 2060, subsection 3, the Maine Health and Higher 16 Educational Facilities Authority may issue securities in its own 18 name in an amount up to \$7,000,000, the proceeds of which must be used to provide funds to the Office of the Treasurer of State. 20 The total proceeds must be deposited as follows:

22 With the Senator George J. Mitchell Scholarship Research 1. Institute, \$6,000,000; and

2. With the Endowment Incentive Fund, established in Title 26 20-A, section 10006, \$1,000,000, which must used to match private donations to provide scholarships and financial assistance to residents of the State to attend a postsecondary educational 28 program at the University of Maine System and each of its 30 universities, the Maine Technical College System and each of its colleges or the Maine Maritime Academy.

Sec. 10. Transfer of funds. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised 34 Statutes, Title 33, section 1964, the administrator of the Abandoned Property Fund shall retain \$1,163,000 within the fund at the end of fiscal year 2000-01. On October 1, 2001, the 36 administrator shall transfer \$1,013,000 to the General Fund.

Sec. 11. State Controller; postclosing. The State Controller is 40 authorized to keep open the official system of general accounts of State Government for fiscal year 2000-01 in order to make post-closing entries and adjustments to carry out the provisions 42 of this Act. 44

Sec. 12. Report out legislation. The Joint Standing Committee on 46 Education and Cultural Affairs may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature concerning the 48 Maine Scholarship Foundation, including methods of funding and eligibility criteria.

HOUSE AMENDMENT '

The amendment eliminates the portions of the bill that 2 established the Maine Scholarship Foundation, including all provisions that would have capitalized the Maine Scholarship 4 Fund. The amendment reduces the General Fund appropriations included in the bill by \$374,571 in fiscal year 2001-02 and 6 \$112,429 in fiscal year 2002-03.

The bill, as amended, includes General Fund appropriations 10 of \$143,000 and \$870,000 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively, to the Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority for the first 2 years of an estimated 10 12 years of debt service payments on bonds that will be issued by 14 the authority for the Endowment Incentive Fund administered by the Office of the Treasurer of State and for the Senator George 16 J. Mitchell Scholarship Research Institute.

18 The bill, as amended, increases General Fund revenue by \$1,013,000 in fiscal year 2001-02 to offset General Fund appropriations included in the bill by requiring that amount to 20 carry forward from the Abandoned Property Fund for fiscal year 22 2000-01 to fiscal year 2001-02 at which time the amount will be transferred to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

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#### SUMMARY

28 This amendment postpones the effective date of the Maine Scholarship Foundation created in the bill and committee 30 amendment to July 1, 2002 and authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs to report out 32 legislation regarding the foundation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.

The amendment also amends the laws of the Maine Health and 36 Higher Educational Facilities Authority to allow the authority to issue bonds to provide additional capitalization for the Maine Scholarship Endowment Fund. It authorizes the authority to issue 38 up to \$7,000,000 in securities of which \$1,000,000 will be provided to the Endowment Incentive Fund and \$6,000,000 will be 40 provided to the Senator George J. Mitchell Scholarship Research 42 Institute. The \$1,000,000 provided to the Endowment Incentive Fund must be used to match private donations for scholarships and financial assistance for students at the University of Maine 44 System, the Maine Technical College System or the Maine Maritime 46 Academy. It provides General Fund appropriations to the authority for the first 2 years of debt service payments associated with that issuance. 48

50 Finally, the amendment requires the transfer of \$1,013,000

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to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the Abandoned Property Fund to offset the General Fund appropriations included in the amendment.
