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#### STATE OF MAINE SENATE 120TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

14 SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 16 799, L.D. 1043, Bill, "An Act to Increase Access to Higher Education"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of sections 1 and 2 and inserting in their place the following:

22 'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2052, as amended by PL 1993, c. 390, §1, is further amended to read:

#### §2052. Declaration of necessity

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It is declared that for the benefit of the people of the 28 State, the increase of their commerce, welfare and prosperity and the improvement of their health and living conditions, it is essential that health care facilities within the State be 30 provided with appropriate additional means to expand, enlarge and 32 establish health care facilities and other related facilities; that this and future generations of students be given the fullest opportunity to learn and to develop their intellectual 34 capacities; and that it is the purpose of this chapter to provide 36 a measure of assistance and an alternative method to enable health care facilities and institutions for higher education in the State to provide the facilities and structures needed to 38 accomplish the purposes of this chapter, to assist gualified residents of the State to attend postsecondary educational 40 programs in the State, all to the public benefit and good, and the exercise of the powers, to the extent and manner provided in 42 this chapter, is declared the exercise of an essential 44 governmental function.

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16. Bulk purchases. To purchase, lease or otherwise 8 acquire, finance, sell and transfer for, to or on behalf of itself and any eligible entities organized pursuant to the United 10 States Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 or in partnership with any of its eligible entities organized pursuant to the United States Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 commodities necessary 12 for the daily operation of the facilities of the eligible 14 entities, including, but not limited to, electricity, petroleum products, fuel oil and natural gas. For purposes authorized in 16 this subsection, the University of Maine System and its colleges and universities are eligible participating institutions under the definition of eligible participant for the authority; and 18

20 Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§17, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 385, §4, is amended to read:
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17. Nonprofit corporation. In accordance with the 24 limitations and restrictions of this chapter, to cause any of its powers, duties, programs or operations to be carried out by one or more nonprofit corporations. Nonprofit corporations acting at 26 the direction of the authority must be organized and operated 28 under the Maine Nonprofit Corporation Act. For the purposes authorized in this section the University of Maine System and its 30 colleges and universities are eligible participating institutions under the definition of eligible participant for the authority -; 32 and

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Sec. 6. 22 MRSA §2055, sub-§18 is enacted to read:

36 18. Bonds for grants to Maine students. To borrow money and issue bonds, notes, bond anticipation notes and other 38 obligations of the authority for the purpose of making loans and grants to foundations or programs that in turn make or match scholarship grants to the State's high school graduates or other 40 students for postsecondary education. These high school 42 graduates or other students must be residents of the State who are or will be attending Maine institutions of higher education. The provisions of section 2061 are not applicable to any 44 obligations described in this subsection. The authority at no time may have bonds outstanding, excluding refunding bonds, for 46 the purposes of this subsection in an amount in excess of \$15,000,000. 48

Sec. 7. 22 MRSA §2061, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 390, §23, is further amended to read:

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1. Assistance. Such project will enable or assist a health care facility to fulfill its obligation to provide health care
facilities or an institution for higher education to provide educational facilities within the State or, in the case of a
Maine scholarship provider or similar eligible institution, the opportunity for state residents to attend postsecondary
educational programs in the State;

 Sec. 8. Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority; issuance of securities. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes,
 Title 22, section 2060, subsection 3, the Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority may issue securities in its own name in an amount up to \$7,000,000, the proceeds of which must be used to provide funds to the Office of the Treasurer of State.
 The total proceeds must be deposited as follows:

18 1. With the Senator George J. Mitchell Scholarship Research Institute, \$6,000,000; and

With the Endowment Incentive Fund, established in Title
 20-A, section 10006, \$1,000,000, which must used to match private donations to provide scholarships and financial assistance to
 residents of the State to attend a postsecondary educational program at the University of Maine System and each of its
 universities, the Maine Technical College System and each of its colleges or the Maine Maritime Academy.

Sec. 9. Transfer of funds. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised 30 Statutes, Title 33, section 1964, the administrator of the Abandoned Property Fund shall retain \$1,163,000 within the fund 32 at the end of fiscal year 2000-01. On October 1, 2001, the administrator shall transfer \$1,013,000 to the General Fund.

Sec. 10. State Controller; postclosing. The State Controller is authorized to keep open the official system of general accounts of State Government for fiscal year 2000-01 in order to make post-closing entries and adjustments to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Sec. 11. Retroactivity. That section of this Act that requires the administrator of the Abandoned Property Fund to transfer funds from the Abandoned Property Fund to the General Fund applies retroactively to June 1, 2001.'

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SENATE AMENDMENT " H" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 799, L.D. 1043

The bill, as amended, includes General Fund appropriations of \$143,000 and \$870,000 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively, to the Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority for the first 2 years of an estimated 10 years of debt service payments on bonds that will be issued by the authority for the Endowment Incentive Fund administered by the Office of the Treasurer of State and for the Senator George J. Mitchell Scholarship Research Institute.

10 The bill, as amended, increases General Fund revenue by \$1,013,000 in fiscal year 2001-02 to offset General Fund 12 appropriations included in the bill by requiring that amount to carry forward from the Abandoned Property Fund from fiscal year 14 2000-01 to fiscal year 2001-02 at which time the amount will be transferred to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

**SUMMARY** 

This amendment strikes the Maine Scholarship Foundation created in the bill and committee amendment.

The amendment also amends the laws of the Maine Health and 24 Higher Educational Facilities Authority to allow the authority to issue bonds to provide additional capitalization for the Maine 26 Scholarship Endowment Fund. It authorizes the authority to issue up to \$7,000,000 in securities of which \$1,000,000 will be provided to the Endowment Incentive Fund and \$6,000,000 will be 28 provided to the Senator George J. Mitchell Scholarship Research Institute. The \$1,000,000 provided to the Endowment Incentive 30 Fund must be used to match private donations for scholarships and financial assistance for students at the University of Maine 32 System, the Maine Technical College System or the Maine Maritime It provides General Fund appropriations to 34 Academy. the authority for the first 2 years of debt service payments associated with that issuance. 36

Finally, the amendment requires the transfer of \$1,013,000 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the
 Abandoned Property Fund to offset the General Fund appropriations included in the amendment.
