HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 308, L.D. 1055, Bill, "An Act to Regulate Push Polling"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 4 in paragraph A by striking out the first 3 lines (page 1, lines 7 to 9 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

'A. "Push poll" means any series of more than 750 telephone surveys for a candidate for the State House of Representatives, 1,500 telephone surveys for a candidate for State Senate, 3,000 telephone surveys for a congressional candidate or 5,000 telephone surveys for a gubernatorial candidate that are commenced within 5 days of an election and that interview voters and are designed to influence a voter's decision with a series of questions that:'


