SENATE AMENDMENT "*A*" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 331, L.D. 1099, Bill, "An Act to Permit Involuntary Medication of Mentally Ill Persons Residing in Department of Corrections Facilities"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the first line after the enacting clause (page 2, line 9 in amendment).

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of Part B.

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.


FISCAL NOTE

The amendment reduces the General Fund cost of the bill by \$9,015 in fiscal year 2001-02 by eliminating the part of the bill that created a legislative study commission.

As amended, the bill does not have any impact on the Legislature.

SUMMARY

This amendment removes Part B, relating to establishing a commission to study the needs of persons with mental illness who are incarcerated.
