### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1301, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1997, c. 437, §30, is further amended to read:

5. Permanent license number. The Secretary of State shall collect, store and verify a person's social security number upon application or renewal for a license or nondriver identification card number and may use that number to establish a permanent license number or nondriver identification card number. A minister, member of a religious order or Christian Science practitioner who has received an exemption from self-employment tax from the federal Internal Revenue Service is exempt from the provisions of this subsection.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill exempts a minister, member of a religious order or Christian Science practitioner who has received an exemption from self-employment tax from the federal Internal Revenue Service from the requirement that a person's social security number be provided upon application or renewal for a license or nondriver identification card.
