	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §907 is enacted to read:

	ne Secretary of State shall send by regular mail to every
	egistered voter a notice detailing any statewide direct petition
	nat will appear on the ballot. The notice must be in a

	2. Notice contents. The booklet must include for each
<u>d</u> .	rect initiative question:
	A. The complete text of the initiative legislation that
	appeared on the petition, including the summary;
	B. A neutral nonpartisan analysis of the effect of passage
	in existing laws;
	C. A statement of fiscal and tax consequences of the
	initiative legislation; and
	D. Statements by proponents and opponents and rebuttals to
	those statements.
	3. Rulemaking. The Secretary of State shall adopt routing
te	echnical rules in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375
	abchapter II-A to implement this section.
	SUMMARY
	This bill requires the Secretary of State to send a bookle
	every registered voter in the State detailing the petition
	anguage, providing an analysis of tax and fiscal consequence
