50	The Maine Arborist Advisory Council, as established in Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 1-A and referred to in this

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section as the "council," advises the commissioner on the licensing and enforcement of arborists in the State.

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4	1. Membership; terms; meetings; removal. The council consists of 7 members appointed by the commissioner. Of the 7
6	members, one must be a member representing the public and 6 must be arborists licensed by the State. In addition, one must be a
8	licensed arborist employed by a municipality of the State; one must be an employee of an electrical transmission company; and
10	one must be a self-employed arborist. All regions of the State must be represented on the council.
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14	Members serve for a term of 3 years. At the end of a term an outgoing member serves until a successor has been appointed. A member may not serve more than 2 consecutive terms.
16	The council shall meet at least annually to conduct business and
18	to elect officers. A quorum consists of at least 4 members. The affirmative vote of a majority of the members present is
20	necessary to decide any business brought before the council.
22	A member may be removed by the commissioner for:
24	A. Failure to attend council meetings;
26	<u>B. Failure to maintain a valid arborist license, if required to do so;</u>
28	C Nowing out of the States or
30	<u>C. Moving out of the State; or</u>

	Members may not be compensated except for expenses incurred in
34	attending meetings. A commercial arborist who is a present or former member of the council may not use membership on the
36	council in the advertising of the arborist's business.
38	2. Duties of council. The council shall:
40	A. Consult with the department on matters in which the members have individual or collective expertise;
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44	B. Assist the department in developing and updating arborist exams;
46	C. Recommend to the department amendments to arborist licensing laws and rules to ensure they properly regulate
48	the activities of licensed arborists in the State; and
50	D, Assist the department with investigating complaints of

unprofessional conduct and recommend a course of action to resolve such complaints.

SUMMARY

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This bill changes the penalty for violating the arborist licensing laws from a criminal to a civil violation 8 and establishes a fine of up to \$500 per day for each day the statute 10 is violated. It allows actions to be brought against individuals who violate this statute in either District Court or Superior Court. It eliminates the exemption to the licensing requirement 12 for tree removal in municipalities having populations under 2,500 It eliminates the requirement of examining applicants 14 people. for restricted licenses in those subjects to which their activities are restricted, thereby allowing the State to examine 16 applicants in a broader category of subject areas. It 18 establishes the Maine Arborist Advisory Council to advise the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources on the operation and enforcement of the arborist licensing laws. 20

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
