26	1. Membership. The task force consists of 21 members as
28	follows.
30	A. Seven members represent state agencies:
32	(1) The commissioner or the commissioner's designee;
34	(2) The Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural
	Resources or the commissioner's designee;
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	(3) The Commissioner of Transportation or the
38	<u>commissioner's designee;</u>
40	(4) The Chancellor of the University of Maine System
40	or the commissioner's designee representing county
42	extension associations; and
44	(5) Three members from the Department of
	Conservation: one representative each from the Bureau
46	of Parks and Lands, the Maine Forest Service and the
	Maine Natural Areas Program appointed by the
48	<u>Commissioner of Conservation.</u>
50	B. Five members represent federal agencies and are selected
50	by the respective agencies:

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2	(1) One representative of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service;
4	(2) One representative of the National Park Service assigned to Acadia National Park;
6	(3) One representative of the United States Department

14	(5) One representative of the Natural Resources Conservation Service within the United States Department of Agriculture.

18	C. Nine members represent the public and are appointed by the Governor:
20	(1) One representative of commercial tree and garden nurseries;

24	(2) One representative of home gardeners:
26	(3) One representative of municipal government;
20	(4) One representative of a statewide sportsperson's
28	association;
30	(5) One representative of a statewide outdoor recreation group; and

	(6) Four public members who have demonstrated
34	<u>experience or interest in the area of fish and wildlife</u> threats posed by aquatic and terrestrial invasive or

38	2. Terms: chair. Members representing state and federal
40	agencies serve ex officio until replaced. Members appointed by the Governor serve 4-year terms, except that, of the initial
42	appointments, 4 must be for 3 years, including 2 of the public members, and 4 must be for 4 years, including the other 2 public
14	members, Members serve until their successors are appointed and
44	<u>gualified. A vacancy must be filled for the remainder of the</u> unexpired term. The position of chair must rotate annually
46	among the state agency members.
48	3. Duties. The task force shall:
50	A. Coordinate enforcement of importation and transportation of invasive and exotic species controls;

2	B. Develop a monitoring and educational program;
4	C. Develop a comprehensive policy on fish stocking and introduction of nonnative plant species;
б	D. Provide for a statewide inventory of aquatic and
8	terrestrial invasive and exotic species;
10	E. Encourage the cooperation of state, provincial, federal and nongovernmental agencies in the area of invasive and
12	exotic species control; and
14	F. Determine and make recommendations to the Legislature whether a regulatory program is necessary to control the
16	introduction of invasive and exotic species in the State.
18	4. Staff. The department shall provide staff support. Other state agencies and the University of Maine System shall
20	also provide assistance when requested.
