SENATE AMENDMENT <sup>B</sup> " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 360, L.D. 1198, Bill, "An Act to Refine the Subdivision and Redistricting Authority of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission"

Amend the amendment in section 3 in that part designated "~~S682-B.~~" in subsection 4 in paragraph A in the last line (page 2, line 49 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "resources" the following: 'Primitive recreation may be allowed on a lot transferred in accordance with this subsection'

Further amend the amendment in section 4 in paragraph A in the next to the last line (page 4, line 11 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "agricultural management" the following: 'primitive recreation'

Further amend the amendment by inserting after section 6 the following:

**'Sec. 7. Report.** The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission shall review its subdivision review process, including ways to reduce processing time and cost and to increase predictability, and shall report its findings along with any suggested implementing legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry no later than December 31, 2001. The Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may report out a bill during the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature implementing the recommendations in the report.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**FISCAL NOTE**

4 The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission within the  
6 Department of Conservation will incur some minor additional costs  
8 to submit a required report to the Legislature. These costs can  
10 be absorbed within the commission's existing budgeted resources.

**SUMMARY**

12 This amendment allows primitive recreation to take place on  
14 lots transferred for forest management, agricultural management  
16 or conservation of natural resources. The amendment also  
18 requires the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission to review its  
20 subdivision review process and report back to the Joint Standing  
22 Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.
