This bill includes net Federal Block Grant allocations totalling \$1,377,295 and \$1,377,295 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 10 2002-03, respectively, to the Temporary Assistance for Needy 12 Families program within the Department of Human Services, as a result of offsetting allocations and deallocations and from a transfer from the TANF Reserve, to provide a 5% increase in the 14 maximum level of assistance in the TANF program. Beginning with 16 the 2004-2005 biennium, this bill requires the Department of Human Services to include funding for the 5% benefit increase 18 within its current services budget request. Funding for this benefit increase in the 2004-2005 biennium is expected to be available due to further declines in caseload. 20

22 This bill also includes offsetting allocations and deallocations of \$1,000,000 annually to reflect the requirement 24 that the Department of Human Services utilize unexpended TANF Block Grant funds to support a portion of the 5% increase in the 26 maximum level of assistance.

28 The Governor's "current services" budget, L.D. 300, also utilized the excess allocation in the TANF Block Grant and the 30 TANF Reserve to fund child care services. Committee Amendment "A" to L.D. 300 does not utilize the TANF Reserve or the excess 32 allocation in the TANF Block Grant.'

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38 This amendment replaces the bill. It provides Federal Block Grant Fund allocations to the Temporary Assistance for Needy 40 Families program within the Department of Human Services totaling \$2,377,295 and \$2,377,295 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, 42 respectively, to provide a 5% increase in the maximum level of assistance in the TANF program.

**SUMMARY** 

Beginning with the 2004-2005 biennium, the Department of Human Services must include funding for the 5% benefit increase within its current services budget request.

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This amendment adds an allocation section to fund the TANF 50 increase and a fiscal note to the bill.
