42	The restoration of certain suspended driver's licenses will result in insignificant increases of Highway Fund revenue collected by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department

The additional workload and administrative costs associated 2 with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

10 This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. The amendment gives the court 12 discretion to order a license suspension for a person convicted of theft of motor fuels, instead of making the suspension mandatory. 14

16 The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
