	1. Disclosure of company information. Any person or entity
	organized under the laws of this State that is authorized to do
	business in this State pursuant to Title 13-A, section 1201 or
	that has otherwise appointed a registered agent for service of process in this State in accordance with Title 13-A, section 1202
	must make available either at or from any publicly accessible
	site on the Internet that it operates or maintains the name of
	the legal owner of each domain name from which the site is
į	accessible, the address of its principal office, wherever
	located, and information pertaining to its designated registered
ŝ	agent for service of process in this State.
	2. Appointment of registered agent required. Any person or
	entity that is not organized under the laws of this State, is not authorized to do business in this State or has not otherwise
	appointed a registered agent for service of process in this State
	and that sells or leases goods or services to residents in this
	State via the Internet may not designate, whether contractually
	or otherwise, a forum other than a forum in this State for the
j	resolution of disputes pertaining to that Internet activity,
1	unless such person appoints and maintains a registered agent for
	service of process in this State and information pertaining to
	that agent for service of process is available from its publicly
į	accessible site or sites on the Internet.
	3. Jurisdiction; compliance not dispositive. The
	appointment of a registered agent for service of process pursuant
	to subsection 2 does not in itself constitute the transaction of
	business with this State or, absent other evidence, otherwise
	avail the person or entity to jurisdiction in the State as set
	forth in Title 14, section 704-A, nor does compliance with
į	subsection 2 act as a waiver of jurisdiction by the State.
	4. Registered agent must be authorized to do business in
	State. The registered agent to accept service of process
	appointed pursuant to subsection 2 must be an individual, a
	domestic corporation, a foreign corporation, a limited liability company or a limited liability partnership authorized to do
	business in the State. Information concerning the registered
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agent must include the name and address of the registered agent in the State.

5. Noncompliance. If a person or entity is not organized under the laws of this State, is not authorized to do business in this State or has not otherwise appointed a registered agent for service of process in this State and sells or leases goods or services to residents of this State via the Internet and does not comply with the requirements of subsection 2, any dispute involving a resident of the State that pertains to that Internet activity must be properly brought in the courts of the State if that activity is deemed by a presiding court as an act described in Title 14, section 704-A regardless of any contractual provision designating a forum other than this State.
