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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$4,000 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the State Harness Racing Commission within the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to cover the additional operating expenses that will be incurred by department personnel in traveling to certain facilities to conduct required audits.

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Allowing certain types of telephone wagering will increase General Fund revenue collected by the State Harness Racing Commission by \$50,600 and \$57,400 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively.

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Allowing certain types of telephone wagering will also increase dedicated revenue collections. The estimated increases of dedicated revenue to the State Harness Racing Commission are \$104,600 and \$118,600 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively. The bill includes additional Other Special Revenue allocations of the same amounts for the commission.

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This bill may both increase and decrease prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.36 per day per prisoner. The net effect on the number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs or savings to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

28 30 The net effect on the Judicial Department's workload and administrative costs will be minimal. The net effect on the collections of fines will also be insignificant.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment allows licensed off-track betting facilities and any facilities licensed to conduct simulcast racing to conduct telephone wagering on races. The amendment also adds a minimum deposit requirement and states that accounts may be established only by residents of this State. The amendment also clarifies that telephone account wagers may not be placed using a credit card. It also adds an appropriation section, an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
