An Act Regarding Registration of Voters on Election Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §121, sub-§1-A, as amended by PL 1999, c. 426, §6, is further amended to read:

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1-A. Identification and proof. Registration applications taken by outside agencies must be transferred to the Secretary of
8 State within 5 days of receipt. An applicant who attempts to register within 20 days of an election must be advised that the
10 registrar might not receive the application before that election, but that the applicant may register in person before or on
12 election day.

Registration applications received by the Secretary of State from 14 outside agencies 21 days or more before an election must be 16 transferred to the appropriate registrar's office within 10 days Registration applications received by the Secretary of receipt. of State from outside agencies 20 days or less before an election 18 must be transferred to the appropriate registrar's office within 20 5 days of receipt. Registration applications by mail or by a 3rd person must be received in the registrar's office by the close of business on the 10th business day before election day in order 22 for persons to appear on the list of registered voters for that 24 election. If the registrar's office is not open on that day, the registrar must accept applications by mail that are received on the next day the registrar's office is open. 26

A person who registers during the 9 business days before election day or on election day shall register in person and show proof of
identity and residency. For a person who registers on election day, whether that person has shown satisfactory proof of identity
and residency is in the sole discretion of the registrar. If satisfactory proof of identity and residency can not be provided
to the registrar or deputy, the person's name is placed on the voting list and the person casts a challenged ballot.

Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §122, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1995, c. 459, 38 §14, is further amended to read:

Election day registration. The registrar shall accept 40 4. registrations of applicants who appear in person on election day and show proof of identity and residency. Whether an applicant 42 has shown satisfactory proof of identity and residency is in the sole discretion of the registrar. The registrar shall issue to 44 each ef-these-applicants applicant who shows satisfactory proof of identity and residency a certificate entitling the applicant 46 to be placed on the voting list at the voting place. Only one certificate may be issued to a person. An applicant whose 48 address has changed since the applicant last voted must vote

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SUMMARY

This bill provides a registrar of voters of a municipality 8 the sole discretion to determine whether a person who seeks to register to vote on election day has shown satisfactory proof of 10 identity and residency.

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
