section does not exempt the businesses or facilities specified in sections 3205 and 3207 from closing in any municipality until the requirements of those sections have been met; stores wherein no
reduttements of those sections have been met; stores wherein no
more than 5 persons, including the proprietor, are employed in
the usual and regular conduct of business; stores which have no
more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space,
excluding back room storage, office and processing space; and
stores with more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer
selling space which engage in retail sales and which do not
require, as a condition of employment, that their employees work
on Sundays. If an employer decreases the average weekly work
hours of an employee who has declined to work on Sundays, it is
prima facie evidence that the employer has required Sunday work
as a condition of employment in violation of this section, unless
the employer and employee agreed that the employee would work on
Sundays when the employee was initially hired. In no event,
however, may any store having more than 5,000 square feet of
interior customer selling space be open on Easter Day, : Memorial
Day, the last Monday in May, but if the Federal Government
designates May 30th as the date for observance of Memorial Day,
May 30th; Thanksgiving Day; and Christmas Day. Notwithstanding
this section, a facility engaged in a manufacturing enterprise,
as defined in Title 10, section 963-A, subsection 32, may not
operate on Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, but if the
Federal Government designates May 30th as the date for observance
of Memorial Day, May 30th.'

The requirement that certain stores be closed on Memorial Day will decrease sales and use tax collections by \$41,947 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$44,045 in fiscal year 2002-03. The reduction of these tax collections will decrease the amounts transferred to the Local Government Fund for state-municipal revenue sharing in those years by \$2,139 and \$2,246, respectively. The resulting net reductions of General Fund

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revenue will be \$39,808 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$41,799 in fiscal year 2002-03. The required closure of certain manufacturing enterprises on Memorial Day will result in wage and salary losses. The reduction of individual income tax collections that may result can not be determined at this time.

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This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.36 per day per prisoner. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

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The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report, requires stores having more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space and manufacturing facilities to be closed on Memorial Day. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
