Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3204, 2nd \P , as amended by PL 1999, c. 657, §7, is further amended to read:

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6 This section does not apply to: The operation or maintenance of common, contract and private carriers; taxicabs; airplanes; 8 newspapers; radio and television stations; hotels, motels. rooming houses, tourist and trailer camps; restaurants; garages and motor vehicle service stations; retail monument dealers; 10 automatic laundries; machines that vend anything of value, including, but not limited to, a product, money or service; a 12 satellite facility approved by the Superintendent of Banking 14 under Title 9-B; or comparable facility approved by the appropriate federal authority; pharmacies; greenhouses; seasonal stands engaged in sale of farm produce, dairy products, seafood 16 or Christmas trees; public utilities; industries normally kept in continuous operations, including, but not limited to, electric 18 generation plants, pulp and paper plants and textile plants; processing plants handling agricultural produce or products of 20 the sea; ship chandleries; marinas; establishments primarily selling boats, boating equipment, sporting equipment, souvenirs 22 and novelties; motion picture theatres; public dancing; sports and athletic events; bowling alleys; displaying or exploding 24 fireworks, under Title 8, chapter 9-A; musical concerts; educational, scientific or philosophical lectures; religious. 26 scenic, historic, recreational and amusement facilities; real estate brokers and real estate sales representatives; mobile home 28 brokers and mobile home sales representatives; provided that this section does not exempt the businesses or facilities specified in 30 sections 3205 and 3207 from closing in any municipality until the requirements of those sections have been met; stores wherein no 32 more than 5 persons, including the proprietor, are employed in the usual and regular conduct of business; stores which have no 34 more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space, excluding back room storage, office and processing space; and 36 stores with more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space which engage in retail sales and which do not 38 require, as a condition of employment, that their employees work If an employer decreases the average weekly work 40 on Sundays. hours of an employee who has declined to work on Sundays, it is prima facie evidence that the employer has required Sunday work 42 as a condition of employment in violation of this section, unless the employer and employee agreed that the employee would work on 44 Sundays when the employee was initially hired. In no event, however, may any store having more than 5,000 square feet of 46 interior customer selling space be open on Easter Day, : Memorial 48 Day, the last Monday in May, but if the Federal Government designates May 30th as the date for observance of Memorial Day, May 30th; Independence Day, July 4th; Veterans' Day, November 50
