An Act to Allow Fire Police Constables to use Roof-mounted Emergency Lights.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2054, sub-§2, ¶F, as amended by PL 1995, c. 22, §1, is further amended to read: Only vehicles listed in this paragraph, rural mail vehicles as provided in paragraph C, subparagraph (5) and 8 school buses may be equipped with, display or use a red auxiliary or emergency light. 10 (1) Emergency lights used on an 12 emergency medical service vehicle, a fire department vehicle, a fire vehicle or a hazardous 14 response vehicle must emit a red light or a combination of red and white light. 16 The municipal officers or a municipal official 18 designated by the municipal officers, with the approval of the fire chief, may authorize an active member of a 20 municipal or volunteer fire department to use a flashing red signal light not more than 5 inches in 22 diameter on a vehicle. The light may be displayed but may be used only while the member is en route to or at 24 the scene of a fire or other emergency. The light must as near as practicable registration plate on the front of the vehicle or on 26 the dashboard. A light mounted on the dashboard must 28 shielded so that the emitted light does not interfere with the operator's vision. 30 Members of an emergency medical service licensed 32 by Maine Emergency Medical Services may display and use on a vehicle a flashing red signal light of the same proportion, in the same location and under the same 34 conditions as those permitted municipal and volunteer 36 firefighters, when authorized by the chief official of the emergency medical service. 38 (4) A sworn fire police constable may use a flashing 40 red signal light, which may be permanently mounted on the roof of the vehicle, only while the constable is at the scene of a fire or other emergency. 42

This bill allows fire police constables, who are used for traffic and crowd control at the scene of an emergency, to use permanently roof mounted flashing red signal lights while the constable is at the scene of a fire or other emergency.
