6	2. Culling required. In the coastal waters northerly and inshore of the international bridge that connects Lubec to

10	3 1/2 inches in the longest diameter. Those scallops that are less than 3 1/2 inches must be immediately liberated. It is
12	prima facie evidence of possession of illegal scallops if a vessel contains scallops less than 3 1/2 inches while a scallop
14	boat license holder or crew member is shucking scallops.
16	3. Violation. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation. The following penalties apply:
