	Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §151, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 885,
4	Pt. A, §8 and as affected by §§9 to 11, is amended to read:
6	5. Voting requirements. The board may take action only by majority vote of its membership. Decisions regarding the
8	employment of an executive director andtheappointmentand retention-of-hearing-officers require the affirmative votes of at
10	least 2 board members representing management and at least 2 board members representing labor.
12	Sec. 2. 39-A MRSA §152, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 885,
14	Pt. A, §8 and affected by §§9 to 11, is repealed.
16	Sec. 3. 39-A MRSA §152, sub-§5-A is enacted to read:
18	5-A. Employment of chief hearing officer, hearing officers and mediators. The Governor shall appoint a chief hearing
20	officer, who has broad powers to manage and oversee persons qualified by background and training to serve as hearing officers
22	and mediators. The chief hearing officer must be paid at a rate ranging from \$110,000 to \$125,000 a year.

26	The chief hearing officer shall appoint hearing officers, who may take action and enter orders consistent with this Act in all
28	cases assigned to them by the chief hearing officer. Hearing officers must be paid a salary at a rate ranging from \$80,000 to
30	\$100,000 a year and serve at the discretion of the chief hearing officer for a period of not more than 3 years. Hearing officers
32	are not subject to the Civil Service Law.
34	The chief hearing officer shall appoint mediators, who may take action and enter orders consistent with this Act in all cases
01	assigned to them by the chief hearing officer. Mediators must be
36	paid at a rate ranging from \$30,000 to \$50,000 a year and are not subject to the Civil Service Law.

42	This bill changes the administration of workers' compensation hearings by creating the position of chief hearing
44	officer and providing that the chief hearing officer appoints hearing officers whose tenure is limited to 3 years.
