**An Act to Ensure Proper Funding of the Public Utilities Commission.**

2           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not  
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted  
as emergencies; and

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6           **Whereas,** it is necessary that the Public Utilities  
Commission have sufficient funds to carry out its statutory  
obligations; and

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10           **Whereas,** wholesale electricity markets are currently  
unsettled regionally and nationally, and electricity market rules  
and federal telecommunications rules are being developed and will  
12 significantly impact the overall prices that Maine's electricity  
and telephone consumers pay; and

16           **Whereas,** during fiscal year 2000-01, the Public Utilities  
Commission must maintain its ongoing responsibilities while  
continuing to participate in regional and national activities  
18 that will impact Maine's consumers; and

20           **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
22 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
24 safety; now, therefore,

26           **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

28           **Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §116, sub-§1,** as amended by PL 1999, c. 398,  
Pt. C, §1, is further amended to read:

32           **1. Utilities subject to assessments.** Every transmission  
and distribution, gas, telephone and water utility and ferry  
subject to regulation by the commission is subject to an  
34 assessment on its intrastate gross operating revenues to produce  
no more than \$4,918,000 in revenues annually. The commission  
36 shall increase the assessment to produce an additional \$318,000  
during fiscal year 2001-02 and an additional \$587,000 during  
38 fiscal year 2002-03. The commission shall assess transmission  
and distribution utilities at a rate sufficient to produce  
40 \$3,370,000 and shall assess all other utilities at a rate  
sufficient to produce \$1,548,000. The commission shall increase  
42 the assessment of transmission and distribution utilities to  
produce an additional \$218,000 during fiscal year 2001-02 and an  
44 additional \$402,000 during fiscal year 2002-03. The commission  
shall increase the assessment of all other utilities to produce  
46 an additional \$100,000 during fiscal year 2001-02 and an  
additional \$185,000 during fiscal year 2002-03. The commission  
48 shall determine the assessments annually prior to May 1st and  
assess each utility for its pro rata share for expenditure during  
50 the fiscal year beginning July 1st. Each utility shall pay the

assessment charged to the utility on or before July 1st of each year. Any increase in the assessment that becomes effective subsequent to May 1st may be billed on the effective date of the act authorizing the increase.

A. The assessments charged to utilities under this section are just and reasonable operating costs for rate-making purposes.

B. For the purposes of this section, "intrastate gross operating revenues" means intrastate revenues derived from filed rates, except revenues derived from sales for resale.

C. Gas utilities subject to the jurisdiction of the commission solely with respect to safety are not subject to any assessment.

D. The commission may correct any errors in the assessments by means of a credit or debit to the following year's assessment rather than reassessing all utilities in the current year.

E. The commission may exempt utilities with annual intrastate gross operating revenues under \$50,000 from assessments under this section.

**Sec. 2. Use of unexpended funds.** Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 5, the Public Utilities Commission may expend in fiscal year 2001-02 and fiscal year 2002-03, for the purposes specified in Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 4, 100% of any unexpended funds remaining at the end of the prior fiscal year. Treatment of funds not expended at the end of fiscal year 2002-03 is governed by Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 5.

**Sec. 3. Allocation.** The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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5           **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the  
6 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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#### **SUMMARY**

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11           This bill authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to  
12 release funds designated for salaries and use them for other  
13 commission expenses and to make all funds that were budgeted but  
14 unused in fiscal year 2000-01 available for use in the subsequent  
15 2 fiscal years. This bill allows the commission to maintain all  
16 of its ongoing responsibilities, including protecting Maine's  
17 consumers in regional and national proceedings. The bill also  
18 increases the public utilities assessment for fiscal years  
2001-02 and 2002-03.
