The repeal of the provisions allowing the carry-back of net operating losses will increase corporate income tax collections by \$1,625,000 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$6,313,125 in fiscal year 2002-03. The increase of these tax collections will increase the amounts transferred to the Local Government Fund for state-municipal revenue sharing in those years by \$82,875 and \$321,969, respectively. The resulting net increase of General Fund revenue will be \$1,542,125 in fiscal year 2001-02 and \$6,313,125 in fiscal year 2002-03.

The Bureau of Revenue Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services will incur additional administrative costs related to the cigarette repricing. The amount of General Fund appropriations that may be required by the bureau to cover these additional costs can not be determined at this time.

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SUMMARY

This amendment raises the cigarette tax by 3 mills effective November 1, 2001 to fund the costs of the bill. This amendment creates the Affordable Health Care Fund to assist individuals with the costs of participation in community health access programs. The amendment also adjusts some of the figures in the various appropriations and allocations. It establishes the Maine Health Access Fund to receive funds from the tobacco tax increase and to allocate those funds to health care expansion initiatives.

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also amends the law to enact positive modifications for individuals and corporations, requiring the add-back of any net operating loss deduction carried back for federal income tax purposes. A corresponding negative income modification for individuals and corporations would allow the deduction of any net operating loss carry-back deduction disallowed.
