16	For purposes of determining which data is confidential, all data collected and processed by the Maine Health Data Processing Center is determined to be Maine Health Data Organization data

22	§683. Board of directors; officers
	The Board of Directors of the Maine Health Data Processing
24	<u>Center, referred to in this chapter as the "board of directors,"</u> <u>consists of a minimum of 8 directors elected to serve in that</u>
26	capacity in accordance with this section. The Maine Health Data Organization board of directors shall elect 1/2 of the directors
28	from among its members, and the Maine Health Information Center board of directors shall elect 1/2 of the directors from among
30	its members. The director of the Maine Health Data Organization and the president of the Maine Health Information Center are also
32	ex officio members of the board of directors. A person may not serve as a director for more than 5 years in succession. The
34	board of directors shall elect a chair and a vice-chair.

	5. Cooperation with agencies and organizations. Cooperate
16	with and avail itself of the services of government agencies and
	the University of Maine System and cooperate, assist and
18	otherwise encourage organizations, local or regional, private or
	public, in the various communities of the State in the collection
20	and processing of health care data; and

• •	§686. Prohibited interests of officers, directors and employees
38	
	An officer, director or employee of the Maine Health Data
40	Processing Center or the spouse or dependent children of such a
	<u>person may not receive any direct personal benefit from the</u>
42	activities of the center in assisting any private entity. This
	provision does not prohibit corporations or other entities with
44	which an officer or director is associated by reason of ownership
	or employment from participating in health care data collection
46	or processing activities with the center as long as the ownership
	or employment is made known to the board of directors and that
48	director abstains from voting on matters relating to that
	participation.
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## §687. Funding

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	The State, through the Governor, may accept donations,
4	bequests, devises, grants or other interests of any nature on
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	<u>behalf of the Maine Health Data Processing Center and transfer</u>
