Sec. 3. Rulemaking. The Executive Department, State Planning Office shall adopt major substantive rules on or before December 2 31, 2001, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A, in order to establish the Maine Building Rehabilitation Code established in Title 5, section 3346. 6
