An Act to Hold an Advisory Referendum on Term Limits.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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	Sec. A-1. Advisory referendum on the opinion of citizens of the

	The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall
32	vote by ballot on these questions and designate their choice by a
	cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below
34	the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted,
	counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings
36	and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as
0.0	votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review
38	the returns and if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of Question A, the Governor shall proclaim that

Sec. B-1. Report out a bill. Based on the results of the vote taken pursuant to Part A of this Act, the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs shall report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature to implement the perceived will of the people.

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### **SUMMARY**

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This bill directs the Secretary of State to hold an advisory referendum at a statewide election to determine whether the voters of the State favor amending or repealing the existing state law limiting the terms of Legislators.
