Resolve, to Establish the Legislative Task Force to Make Legislative and Policy Recommendations to Strengthen Consumer Protection and Quality Outcomes for All In-home and Home Health Care Services.

Preamble. Whereas, there is concern that in-home, health and community care providers are understaffed, seriously endangering care that consumers expect and to which they are entitled: and Whereas, understaffing can lead to illnesses and injuries for consumers that actually increase the cost of care; and 8 Whereas, the number of providers and consumers 10 increased, and it is a concern that the ability of the agencies charged with monitoring the quality of care may be compromised because agency staffing has not kept pace with the agencies' 12 responsibilities; and 14 Whereas, it is reported that complaints from consumers are growing in number and seriousness; and 16 Whereas, these issues were the subject of a recommendation 18 of the Commission to Examine Rate Setting and the Financing of 20 Long-term Care Facilities, which reported to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature, and as yet have not been 2.2 addressed by the Legislature; now, therefore, be it Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to 24 Legislative and Policy Recommendations to Strengthen Consumer Protection and Quality Outcomes for All In-home and Home 26 Health Care Services, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established; and be it further 28 30 Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of the following 8 members: 32 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of 34 the Senate, who must be members of different political parties; Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed 36 by the Speaker of the House, one representing the majority party and one representing the minority party; 38 40 Two members of the Long-term Care Steering Committee, one appointed by the President of the Senate and one appointed by 42 the Speaker of the House; and 4. Two representatives of the home health services provider 44 industry, appointed by the Governor; and be it further 46 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member 48 is the Senate chair of the task force and the first named House

of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force;

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and be it further

Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** appointments must be made no later than 15 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the notified Legislative Council must be by all authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the task force shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force no later than 20 days following the effective date of this The commission may hold up to 4 meetings; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall conduct a comprehensive review of in-home, home health and community-based services, including the structure and adequacy of the provider community and its ability to provide the level and quality of care the citizens of the State expect for the State's elderly and disabled citizens. The study will focus on the State's oversight system as well as on the delivery system itself; and be it further

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Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee; and be it further

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Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the task force who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Other members of the task force who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

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Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 2, 2001. If the task force requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

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Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The task force may

not incur expenses that would result in the task force exceeding
its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the
Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly
provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on
the task force's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and
available funds.
