Commission to Study the Health Care Workforce Shortage. 2 Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Health Care Workforce Shortage, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further Sec. 2. Commission membership.  - Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
 - Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services, labor and education and cultural affairs matters no later than January 1, 2003. The joint standing committees of the Legislature have jurisdiction over health and human services, labor and education and cultural affairs matters may report out legislation pursuant to this Resolve to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Commission to Study the Health Care Workforce Shortage to study the labor shortage of health

- professionals in the State and to report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and
- 4 human services, labor and education cultural affairs matters no later than January 1, 2003.
