An Act to Require Truth in Advertising of Natural Water.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §552, as amended by PL 1981, c. 314 and PL 1999, c. 547, Pt. B, §78 and affected by §80, is further amended 4 to read: 6 §552. Food or water labeled or advertised as natural 8 1. Artificial ingredients and pesticides. Ne--food-shall 10 Food may not be labeled or advertised as "natural" unless it is free from any artificial flavoring, color additive or chemical 12 preservative or any other artificial or synthetic ingredient added after harvesting. 14 2. Minimal processing. No--food--shall Food may not be labeled or advertised as "natural" if it has undergone any 16 processing other than minimal processing. 18 Exemptions. Exempted from the provisions of this section 3. 20 are alcoholic beverages subject to the Federal Alcohol Administration Act of 1935; dietary supplements of vitamins, 22 minerals or protein; and natural flavors and colors approved by the Food and Drug Administration for use in food. 24 Natural food symbol. A natural food symbol may be 4. 26 selected and issued under the following provisions. 28 The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources Α. may select an appropriate symbol to designate that a food is found by the department to be a natural food. A person 30 wishing to label any food with the symbol shall must first obtain a license from the department. A person shall may not 32 use the symbol for any food that is not natural. A separate license shall must be obtained for each food. 34 36 в. The commissioner shall issue a license if he--is satisfied that the food proposed to be labeled by the applicant is natural. The commissioner may require a signed 38 affidavit stating the ingredients of the food and may use 40 other methods to determine whether a food is natural. If the commissioner is unable to determine to his the 42 commissioner's satisfaction that a food is natural, he the commissioner is not required to issue a permit. 44 C. A license is valid for one year and may be renewed. The commissioner may charge a fee for a license, provided that 46 the fee is not greater than the actual cost of 48 administration of a license.

D. The commissioner or his a duly authorized agent may 2 refuse to grant or renew a license, after notice and opportunity for a hearing has been provided in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, 4 Title 5, chapter 375, as to adjudicatory proceedings, upon a finding that the licensee has labeled as natural a food that 6 is not natural. The District Court may, in a manner 8 consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, suspend or revoke a license upon 10 finding that the licensee has labeled as natural a food that is not natural. 12 5. Water. Water for sale that is advertised or labeled as "natural" may not have an additive, chemical or any other 14 substance added to the water. 16 **SUMMARY** 18 20 This bill prohibits adding any additive, chemical or other substance to water for sale that is advertised or labeled as "natural." 22
