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#### 14 SUMMARY

- This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, replaces the bill. The amendment accomplishes the following:
- 20 1. Changes the title to reflect the content of the amendment;
- 2. Adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill:
- 3. Establishes a one-year special assessment to be collected from policyholders of insured fire risks located in the State. This special assessment is designed to provide operating revenues for the Office of the State Fire Marshal for fiscal year 2002;
- 4. Increases certain inspection and permit fees collected by the Office of the State Fire Marshal to more accurately reflect the costs associated with those inspections and permits; and

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5. Adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
