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SENATE AMENDMENT "B L.D. 1363

to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 419,

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment would delay the effective date of the bill 4 until May 1, 2003 and reduce the number of new positions added under the bill from 4 to 2. This would decrease the fiscal year 6 2002-03 General Fund appropriation in the bill from \$247,981 to \$39,859. Given the amendment's May 1, 2003 effective date, the 8 fiscal year 2003-04 General Fund cost of the bill would be \$148,623, including \$55,957 for the 2nd year of system 10 development costs, and the fiscal year 2004-05 costs would be \$94,519.
