COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1022, L.D. 1371, Bill, "An Act to Establish the Dairy Industry Fund"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "\$2956-A." in subsection 1 by striking out all of the 2nd sentence (page 1, line 22 to 28 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 'In addition to payments to the commission pursuant to section 2956, a dealer shall deduct 1¢ per hundredweight from amounts paid by the dealer to each Maine milk producer and pay that amount into the fund as a monthly payment.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

2 This bill includes an annual Other Special Revenue
allocation of \$70,000 beginning in fiscal year 2001-02 for the
4 Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to establish
the Dairy Industry Fund.

6 The establishment of a fee to be paid by milk producers will
increase fee collections. The estimated annual increase of
8 dedicated revenue to the Dairy Industry Fund administered by the
Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources is \$70,000
10 beginning in fiscal year 2001-02.'

16 This amendment clarifies that a dealer deducts the 1¢ per
hundredweight for deposit into the Dairy Industry Fund from the
amount paid to a Maine milk producer.
