## SUMMARY

This amendment adds an exemption from immunization requirements for health care workers for persons who decline hepatitis B vaccinations, as provided in federal Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration, OSHA, law and regulations. It requires rules adopted by the Department of Human Services to be consistent with OSHA requirements. The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
