30	SUMMARY					

This amendment replaces the original bill. It directs the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to convene the Air Quality Advisory Committee. Membership on the committee includes representatives of various interests, including Legislative members. The duties of the committee include considering possible future air control strategies, agreements for control strategies with 3rd-party groups, acid and heavy metal deposition, emissions trading and toxic air emissions issues. The committee will be staffed by the Department of Environmental Protection. The committee shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than November 15, 2001. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.
