Resolve, to Create a Stakeholders Group to Modernize Maine's Clean Air Policy.

2	Preamble. Whereas, Maine is a state that is uniquely located to receive transported air pollution from other states; and
4	Whereas, Maine reviewed and developed its clean air policy in 1995; and
8	Whereas, the development of such a policy was undertaken in a collaborative manner by a broad base of interested stakeholders; and
10 1 2	Whereas, that policy is now 6 years old and not reflecting the changes to regulations and requirements governing air policy; and
14	Whereas, there exists a significant need to update, modernize and amend Maine's clean air policy; now, therefore, be it
18 20	Sec. 1. Stakeholders Group to Modernize Maine's Clean Air Policy established. Resolved: That the Stakeholders Group to Modernize Maine's Clean Air Policy, referred to in this resolve as the
22	"stakeholders group," is established; and be it further
24	Sec. 2. Stakeholders group membership; appointments. Resolved: That the stakeholders group consists of the following 12 members:
26	1. Two members of the Senate, one appointed by the
28	President of the Senate and one appointed by the President Pro Tempore, at least one of whom must be from a nonattainment area;
30	2. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed
32	by the Speaker of the House, one of whom is a member of a political party that does not hold a majority of seats in that
34	body and at least one of whom must be from a nonattainment area;
36	3. Two members representing groups involved in environmental or energy matters, one appointed by the President
38	of the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House;
40	4. Two members representing groups involved in business and industrial issues pertaining to clean air issues, appointed by

44	5. One member representing a group involved in petroleum issues, appointed by the Governor;

- 8. The Commissioner of Environmental Protection or the commissioner's designee.; and be it further
 - Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the stakeholders group and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the stakeholders group; and be it further

4. Appointments: meetings. Resolved: all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the appointing must notified Legislative Council be by all authorities once the selections have been made. appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the stakeholders group shall call and convene the first meeting of the stakeholders group no later than 30 days after all members are appointed; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the stakeholders group shall:

1. Review, amend and modernize Maine's clean air policy. In examining the issues, the stakeholders group must ensure that such a policy achieves the requirements of federal law in a manner that costs the least for Maine citizens while being the most equitable. The policy must be scientifically grounded, based on the best data available, which may not be more than 2 years old;

2. Review current air control strategies, possible air control strategies, agreements for control strategies with New England governors and eastern Canadian premieres and 3rd-party groups, including, but not limited to, the Ozone Transport Commission and the Northeast States for Coordinated Air Use Management;

- Review current attainment and nonattainment areas to determine whether recommendations for changes to these areas need to be made; and
- 44 4. Review and update Maine's emission inventory, the 15% rate of progress plan and make whatever recommendations it considers necessary; and be it further
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal

Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the stakeholders group and that the Department of Environmental Protection may provide necessary technical support services; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the stakeholders group who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the stakeholders group. Other members of the stakeholders group who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the stakeholders group shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002. If the stakeholders group requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

26 SUMMARY

This resolve establishes a stakeholders study group to study and recommend changes to Maine's clean air laws.
