28	This bill may increase prosecutions for Class A crimes. Sentences of more than nine months imposed for Class A crimes		
30	must be served in state correctional institutions. The cost to the State per sentence is \$211,893 based upon an average length		
32	of stay of 7 years and 2 months.		
34	This bill may increase prosecutions for Class B crimes. Sentences of more than nine months imposed for Class B crimes		
36	must be served in state correctional institutions. The cost to the State per sentence is \$115,468 based upon an average length		
38	of stay of 3 years and 11 months.		
40	This bill may increase prosecutions for Class C crimes. Sentences of more than nine months imposed for Class C crimes		
42	must be served in state correctional institutions. The cost to the State per sentence is \$71,306 based upon an average length of		
44	stay of 2 years and 5 months.		
46	This bill may increase prosecutions for Class D crimes. If		
48	a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.36 per day per prisoner. The number of		
50	prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.		

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "Ho H.P. 1049, L.D. 1406

The Judicial Department may require additional General Fund
appropriations to cover indigent defense costs related to these
new cases. The amounts can not be estimated at this time. The
additional workload and administrative costs associated with the
minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be
absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
Department. The collection of additional fines may also increase
General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'
