a dental procedure, including, but not limited to, information on the durability, cost, aesthetic quality or other characteristics of the mercury amalgam and alternative materials. The director shall also develop a poster that informs patients of the availability of the brochure.

The Director of the Bureau of Health shall, in consultation with the Department of Environmental Protection, adopt the brochure and the poster described in this subsection as major substantive rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A. The brochure and poster must be provisionally adopted and submitted to the Legislature for consideration during the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. Copies of the brochure and poster must be provided to dentists in the State at cost.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The Bureau of Health within the Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to develop and adopt, through major substantive rules, a brochure and a poster that explain the potential advantages and disadvantages of materials used in dental procedures. These costs can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.

The Department of Environmental Protection will incur some minor additional costs to consult with the Department of Human Services on the development of a brochure and poster pertaining to the use of mercury fillings. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources. The amendment requires the Director of the Bureau of Health within the Department of Human Services to develop and adopt, through major substantive rulemaking, a brochure that explains the potential advantages and disadvantages of mercury amalgam and alternative materials used in dental procedures and a poster informing patients of the availability of the brochure. A dentist who uses mercury amalgam in dental procedures is required, after July 1, 2002, to display the poster in the public waiting area of that dentist's office and to provide each patient with a copy of the brochure. The brochure and the poster are required to be developed in consultation with the Department of Environmental Protection. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
