RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Repeal Constraints on the Property Tax and to Make the State Jointly Responsible with Municipalities for Equity in Education.

Constitutional amendment. Resolved: Two thirds of each 2 branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed: 4 Constitution, Art. IV, Part Third, §23 is repealed. 6 ; and be it further 8 Constitution, Art. VIII, Part First, §1 is amended to read: 10 Section 1. State and towns to support public schools of 12 uniform and high-quality; duty of Legislature. A Because a general diffusion of the advantages of education being is essential to the preservation of the rights and liberties of the 14  $people_{to-promote-this-important-object$ , the Legislature are is both authorized, -- and -it -- shall -- be -- their -- duty and obligated to 16 require,-the-several-towns-to-make that: suitable provision,-at their--own-expense,--for--the-support--and-maintenance-of--public 18 schools+-and-it be made for the support and maintenance of public 20 schools at the expense of the State and its municipalities; each child have reasonable access to suitable educational opportunities and to programs of uniformly high quality; and the 22 burden of support for public schools be equitably allocated among regions, citizens and businesses of the State. It shall further 24 be their duty to encourage and suitably endow, from time to time, 26 as the circumstances of the people may authorize, all academies, colleges and seminaries of learning within the State; provided, that no donation, grant or endowment shall at any time be made by 28 the Legislature to any literary institution now established, or which may hereafter be established, unless, at the time of making 30 such endowment, the Legislature of the State shall have the right 32 to grant any further powers to alter, limit or restrain any of the powers vested in any such literary institution, as shall be 34 judged necessary to promote the best interests thereof. ; and be it further 36 Constitution, Art. IX, §8, as enacted by CR 1999, c. 2, is 38 repealed. 40 ; and be it further 42 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective 44 date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and 46 plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of 48 this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall 10 vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, 12 counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as 14 votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes 16 are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim 18 that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further 20

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

28 This resolution seeks repeal provisions governing to property taxes and to make the State share in the 30 responsibilities to provide suitable, reasonable access to high-quality educational opportunities.
