Further amend the bill in section 9 by striking out all of 2 that part designated "§2361-A." and inserting in its place the following: 4 <u>S2361-A. Aggravated gross weight violations</u> б The operation of a vehicle exceeding the maximum allowable gross vehicle weight by 20% or more is an aggravated gross weight 8 violation. The penalty for an aggravated gross weight violation is the fine established in section 2360, subsection 3.' 10 12 Further amend the bill by inserting after section 11 the following: 14 'Sec. 12. 29-A MRSA §2390, sub-§1, ¶J, as amended by PL 1999, c. 753, $\S7$, is further amended by repealing subparagraph (7). 16 Sec. 13. Report. The Commissioner of Transportation, in 18 cooperation with the Commissioner of Public Safety, shall report 20 to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation by January 2, 2002, including recommended legislation, on holding shippers and 22 brokers of transported cargo responsible for violations of the vehicle weight laws of this State. The report must include an 24 examination of the issues involved and recommendations on the administrative and statutory enforcement mechanisms that would be needed to accomplish the additional responsibility. required report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.

4 The additional costs associated with increasing certain fines can be absorbed by the Judicial Department utilizing existing budgeted resources.' 6

SUMMARY

This amendment reduces certain fines for axle weight 12 violations applicable to vehicles hauling special commodities.

It removes certain repeat violator provisions from the bill. 14

16 The amendment repeals the 80,000 pound gross vehicle weight limit provision for vehicles hauling 53-foot semitrailers.

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It requires the Department of Transportation to report to the Legislature on recommended legislation to hold freight 20 shippers and brokers responsible for overweight trucks. 22

The amendment establishes an effective date of January 31, 24 2002 for the bill except that it provides that that section of the bill that directs the Commissioner of Transportation to 26 report to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the First Regular Session of 28 the 120th Legislature.

It also adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the 30 bill.

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
