Sec. 1. Commission to Examine Methods to Ensure the Safety of 2 Children and Families established. Resolved: That the Commission to Examine Methods to Ensure the Safety of Children and Families, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; 4 and be it further 6 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 8 consists of the following 11 members: 10 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate; 12 2. Two members from the House of Representatives, appointed 14 by the Speaker of the House; One Department of Human Services caseworker, appointed 16 3. by the Commissioner of Human Services; 18 4. One attorney who represents parents in Department of 20 Human Services child protective matters, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 22 5. One parent who contested a Department of Human Services child protection court action to remove a child of the parent and 24 who won in court and regained custody of the child, appointed by the President of the Senate; 26 One parent who contested a Department of Human Services 28 б. child protection action to remove a child of the parent and who 30 regained custody of the child without a court action, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 32 One counselor of parents in a matter in which a child 7. 34 was reunified with the parents, appointed by the President of the Senate; 36 One advocate for children, appointed by the Speaker of 8. the House: and 38 40 9. The Commissioner of Human Services or the commissioner's designee; and be it further 42 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House 44 of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further 46 48 Sec. 4. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 50 Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after all members have been appointed; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study ways to properly protect children in the State from harm and to consider alleged abuses by the Department of Human Services. In conducting the study the commission may:

12 1. Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons;

2. Conduct, summarize and analyze the results of a literature search;

- 18 3. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;
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4. Procure and analyze relevant data;

5. Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal 24 questions within the scope of the study; and

- 6. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related
  to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further
- 30 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall provide necessary staffing services to the 32 commission; and be it further

34 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 36 Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses 38 incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the Other members of the commission who are not commission. otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that 40 they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary 42 expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further 44

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature no later than January 1, 2003. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

2 Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission with assistance from the commission staff shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the 4 commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 6 Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive 8 Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the 10 commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available 12 funds.

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## **SUMMARY**

This resolve establishes the Commission to Examine Methods to Ensure the Safety of Children and Families to study ways to properly protect children in the State from harm and to consider alleged abuses by the Department of Human Services.
