## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §2, as amended by PL 1999, c. 509, §§1 and 2, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read: 4 If a Legislator declines the services of the partisan staff 6 offices, that Legislator is entitled to an amount that represents 8 the proportionate share of the cost as budgeted for the 2 partisan offices for the chamber of which that Legislator is a 10 member. Money received pursuant to this paragraph must be used for constituent services. 12 Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect December 1, 2002. 14 SUMMARY 16 18 This bill allows a Legislator to decline the services of partisan staff and receive a pro rata share of the budgeted costs of the partisan offices to be used directly by the Legislator for 20

constituent services. The bill takes effect December 1, 2002.
