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## SENATE AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1085, L.D. 1454

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This amendment clarifies that only legislative members of the Commission to Study the Implementation of a Unified Emergency Response for Emergency Releases and Spills of Toxic or Hazardous Materials are eligible for the payment of a per diem, which reduces the cost related to the study.

The Legislature will require an additional Other Special Revenue funds allocation of \$5,675 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members and expenses of other eligible members of the Commission to Study the Implementation of a Unified Emergency Response for Emergency Releases and Spills of Toxic or Hazardous Materials and to print the required report. Funds available within the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, Maine Emergency Management Agency's dedicated State Emergency Response Commission account are available to reimburse the Legislature for the commission's costs.

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## **SUMMARY**

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This amendment requires the first meeting of the Commission to Study the Implementation of a Unified Emergency Response for Emergency Releases and Spills of Toxic or Hazardous Materials to be held by August 15, 2001. It also limits payment of a per diem for attendance at commission meetings to Legislators. The amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause.
