	5. Effect of revoked or suspended license. Notwithstanding section, a person whose license to deal in live smelts and

This bill repeals provisions of law governing suspension and revocation of hunting and fishing licenses and directs the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to adopt rules governing the suspension, revocation and reinstatement of these licenses by the commissioner.
