<u>§1611. Definitions</u>

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As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 8 indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

1. Chief. "Chief" means the Chief of the State Police.

 2. Firefighter. "Firefighter" means an active municipal firefighter or an active volunteer firefighter, as defined in
 Title 30-A, section 3151.

 16 3. Law enforcement officer or officer. "Law enforcement officer" or "officer" means an active state police officer,
 18 municipal police officer, county sheriff, deputy sheriff, game warden, fire marshal, liquor enforcement officer or marine patrol
 20 officer in this State.

22 §1612. Death benefit

24 **1. Amount: recipients.** In a case in which the chief determines under rules adopted pursuant to this section that a 26 law enforcement officer has died while in the line of duty or in a case in which the State Fire Marshal determines under rules 28 adopted pursuant to this section that a firefighter has died while in the line of duty, the State shall pay a benefit of 30 \$50,000 as follows:

- A. If there is no surviving child of the firefighter or law enforcement officer, to the surviving spouse of the firefighter or law enforcement officer;
- B. If there is a surviving child or children and a surviving spouse, 1/2 to the surviving child or children of
 the firefighter or law enforcement officer in equal shares and 1/2 to the surviving spouse;
- C. If there is no surviving spouse, to the child or children of the firefighter or law enforcement officer in equal shares; or
- 46 D. If there is no surviving child or spouse of the 46 firefighter or law enforcement officer, to the parent or 48 equal shares.

2. Interim benefit payment. Interim benefits may be paid
 2 as follows.

4	A. When the State Fire Marshal determines upon showing of
б	need and prior to final action that the death of a firefighter is a death for which a benefit will probably be
8	paid, the State Fire Marshal may make an interim benefit payment not exceeding \$3,000 to the individual or
10	<u>individuals entitled to receive a benefit under subsection 1</u> in the manner set out in subsection 1.
12	B. When the chief determines, upon showing of need and prior to final action, that the death of an officer is a
14	death for which a benefit will probably be paid, the chief may make an interim benefit payment not exceeding \$3,000 to
16	the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under subsection 1 in the manner set out in subsection 1.
18	3. Deduction of interim payment. The State Fire Marshal or
20	the chief, as the case may be, shall deduct the amount of an interim payment made pursuant to subsection 2 from the amount of
22	any final benefit paid to the individual or individuals entitled to receive a benefit under subsection 1.
24	4. Repayment of interim payment; waiver. If a final
26	benefit is not paid, the recipient or recipients of any interim payment under subsection 2 are liable for repayment of the amount
28	received. The State Fire Marshal, the case of a firefighter, or the chief, in the case of a law enforcement officer may waive all
30	or part of the repayment if the State Fire Marshal or chief, as the case may be, determines that undue hardship would result from
32	that repayment.
34	5. Execution or attachment prohibited. A benefit paid under this section is not subject to execution or attachment.
36	6. Other benefits. The \$50,000 benefit payable under this
38	section may not be considered a benefit paid under "similar law" for purposes of Title 5, sections 18005 and 18605 and may not be
40	used to reduce any accidental death benefit amount payable under those provisions or under any other provision of law.
42	7. Rulemaking. The State Fire Marshal and the chief shall
44	adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as
46	defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.
